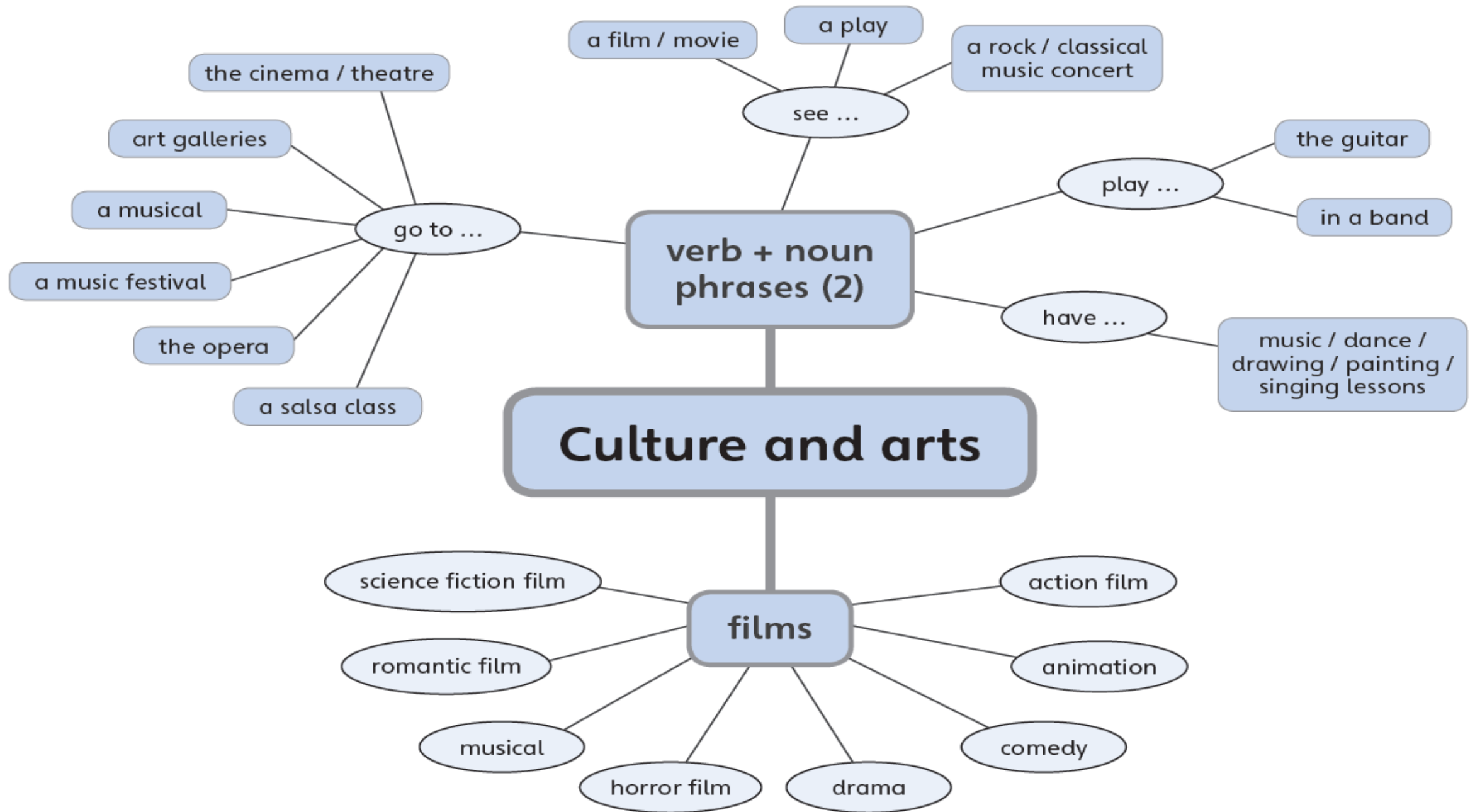

Past Participle

Visited, worked

Simple Past and past participle forms of regular verbs are the **same**. They always end in -ed

Past Participle of irregular verbs can be **different** form or the **same** as simple past. Most verbs follow one of these rules:

put, put

1. No change

rang, rung

2. A vowel change

Chose, chosen

3. We add -n

Wrote, written

4. a vowel change and we add -n

Was-were, been

5. Past participle is different word

There are many **irregular verbs** in simple past. (do not add -ed to irregular verbs)
Each irregular verb has a different form, (go – went) (do – did) (have – had)

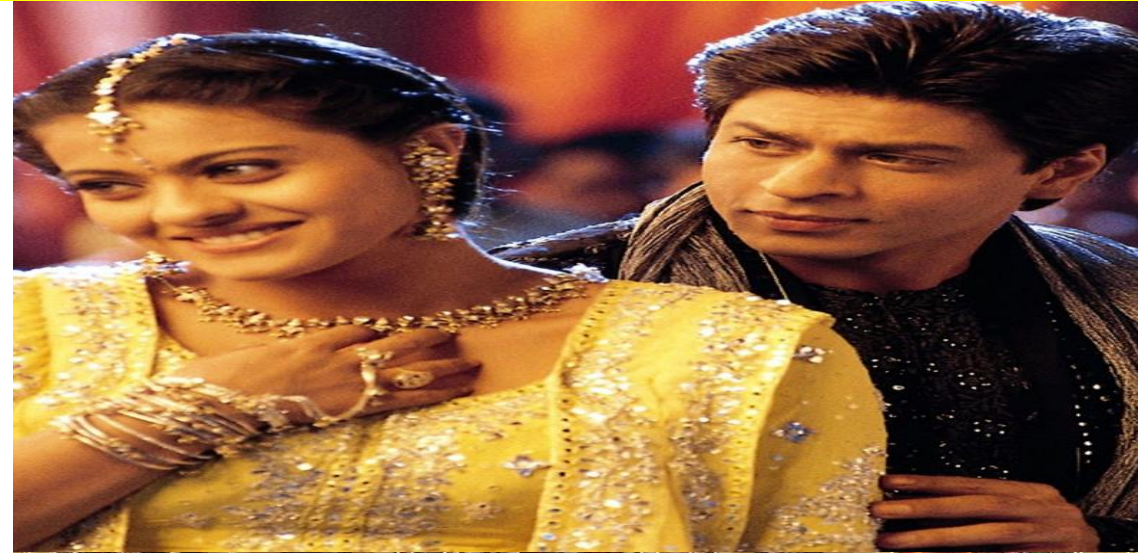

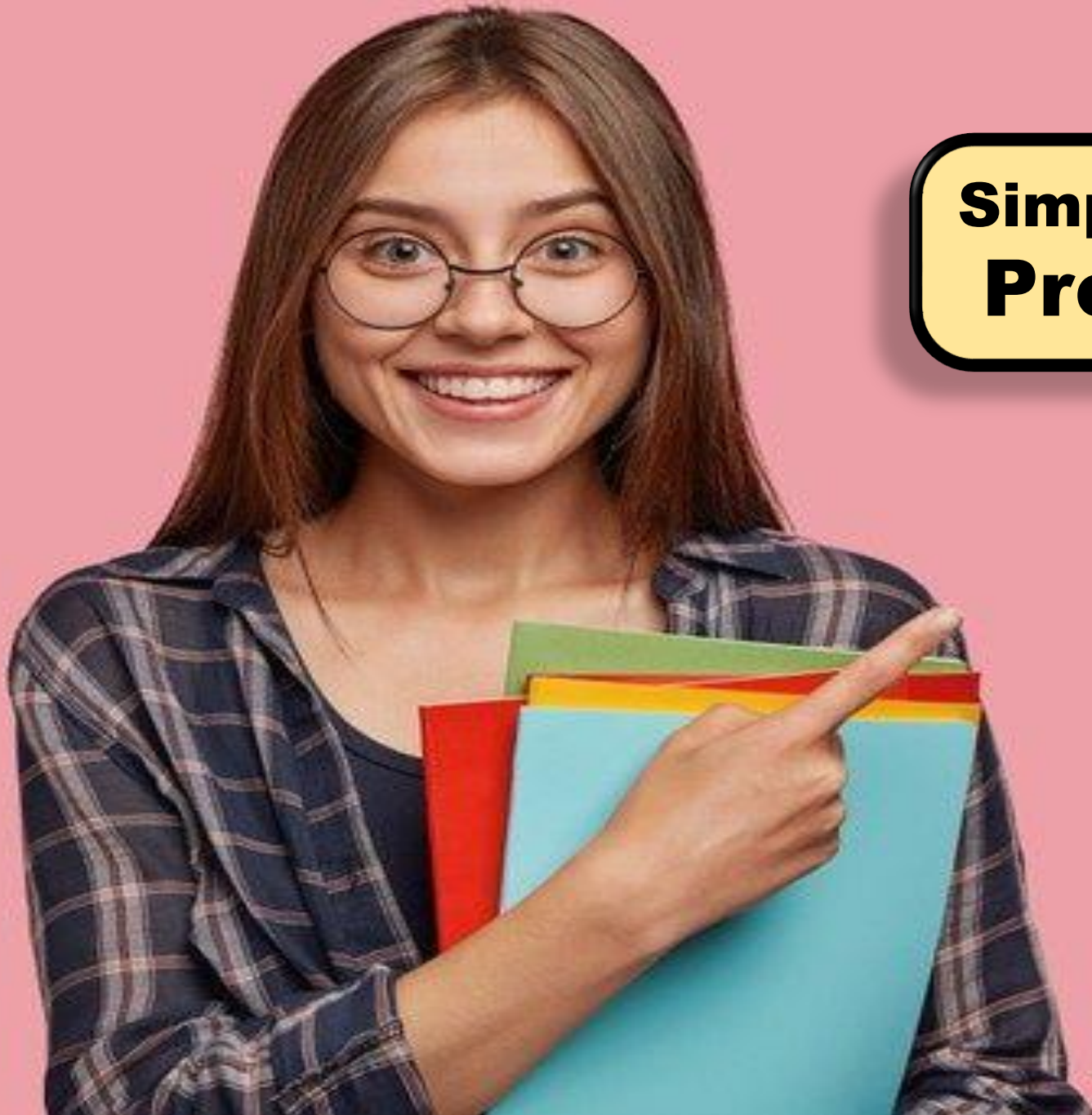
