Present perfect **questions**; Present perfect and **past simple**

1. **You** have seen John. _____ → Have **you** seen John?
2. **He** has finished the report. _____ → Has **he** finished the report?

To make questions in present perfect simple, change order of subject and *have - has*.

Question		Positive short answer	Negative short answer
Have you /we/they/I	eaten breakfast?	Yes, I /you/we/they have .	No, I /you/we/they haven't .
Has he /she/it		Yes, he /she/it has .	No, he /she/it hasn't .

with *yes, no* questions, use short answers use contractions with - short answers.

A. Have you **ever been to China?**

B. Yes, I have. I've been to Beijing twice and Shanghai once.

use ever in questions with simple present perfect.
Ever means at any time in the past.

I've **never travelled by myself, but I'd really like to.**

use never with present perfect to talk about experiences that we have not had.
Never means at no time in the past.

use present perfect to talk about number of times in past we have done sth, without saying exactly when we had experience.

use **Past simple** and **NOT** Present Perfect ...

-I **went** to Florida last January.

-We **painted** the kitchen on Sunday.

1. to say sth happened before now and we know the time.

-She **saw** a film at the cinema last week.

-They **had** lunch at their friend's house yesterday.

2. with finished time expressions, e.g. last week, yesterday, etc.

general past
experience

A **Have** you ever **eaten** any really strange food?

B Yes, **I've eaten** some very strange things in different countries!

detailed past
experience

A What **was** the worst?

B Well, I **ate** snake last year.

we know
exactly when
it happened

A Snake! Yuk! Where **did** you **eat** it?

B A friend of mine **cooked** it for my birthday.
